Tier 2 does not include operational patrols.</p> <p><b>Tier 2</b> Auxiliaries will be under the close supervision of an RCMP regular member and will have peace officer status.</p> <p><b>Tier 2</b> Auxiliaries are expected to contribute a minimum of 120 hours per year to the program including training.</p>	<p><b>Tier 3</b> includes activities from Tier 1 and Tier 2 with the addition of operational patrols, attending calls, check stops, scene security and searches of persons as directed by a Regular Member.</p> <p><b>Tier 3</b> Auxiliaries will be under the close supervision of an RCMP regular member and will have peace officer status.</p> <p><b>Tier 3</b> Auxiliaries are expected to contribute a minimum of 180 hours per year to the program including training.</p>
