The Program's governing legislation is the *Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act* (the Act) and the *Bylaw Notice Enforcement Regulation* (the Regulation).

Program users, including local governments and adjudicators, have raised a number of issues impacting program operations. The Program is seeking input from local governments to better understand the issues and explore options for improvement and modernization.
