

Youth have important perspectives to contribute but lack the knowledge, tools & connections







A program to address the poly-crisis

- Cohort based program of 4 8 young people aged 17-30 working together
- Group makes a living wage for 4 6 months
- Focus is on scaling up climate action projects while training the next generation of leaders
- YCCBC minimizes capacity needed by local governments by leading supervision and admin work



Bringing YCC to Squamish

- Protocol regarding media engagements, communications, etc.
- Liability, indemnity, confidentiality, ms. congeniality,etc.
- Engaged with union no conflict
- Identified potential projects
- Budget!

Budget!

- Total budget for YCC program: \$226,600
- Squamish commitment: **\$115,000**
 - External support for air sealing : \$40,000
 - External support for youth well-being: \$20,000
 - Internal climate plan update outreach: \$15,000
 - Internal Active transportation programming : \$20,000
 - Internal climate operational budget: \$20,000
- Remaining amount secured by YCC **\$111,600**
 - Provincial and Federal funding

Air Sealing project

- Low(est) hanging fruit
- Often payback is months
- Skills easy to learn
- Pre-cursor to fuel switching
- Lack of trades-people

Squamish's emissions in 2017 were approximately 97,000 tonnes CO2e/yr. These emissions primarily relate to transportation (53%), buildings (27%) and waste (20%)

HOW CARBON EMISSIONS IMPACT SQUAMISH

FOOD SECURITY: CLIMATE CHANGE INTERACTS WITH FOOD SECURITY THROUGH ECOLOGICAL IMPACTS, TEMPERATURE CHANGE AND EXTREME EVENTS

CLIMATE CHANGE POSES BOTH LONG-TERM HEALTH RISKS Wality and disease) and short-term health risks ().e. Heat waves and fires).

SEA LEVEL RISE: THE GOVERNMENT OF BUIRECOMMENDS THAT MOUNTIES PLAN FOR ONE METRE OF SEA LEVEL RISE BY 2000 (NOT INCLUDING STORM SURGE FLOODING).

INCREASED FOREST FIRES: FOREST FIRES ARE INCREASING IN FREQUENCY AND SIZE IN CANADA DUE TO INCREASED TEMPERATU CHANGING PRECIPITATION, AND OTHER FACTORS.

EXTREME PRECIPITATION: CLIMATE CHANGE IS CAUSING MORE TREME PRECIPITATION EVENTS, THAT ARE OUT OF NORMAL RANK
